Sunmaya Tamang -61, NP-54, Dubagaun, Kavre joined the Triangle Support Project. Her life was very hard because of the big families (all together 13 members) and she has little income so it was very difficult in obtaining food because of low income. She has frequently needs to knock on the door of the local moneylender. The traditional agriculture system has not been able to provide the enough food for this family, providing only 3 to 6 months of food sufficiency from their own production.

After joining the Triangle project, she obtained the NRs 5,000 through a village committee microloan without any interest, which she used to purchase 1 goats from the locality. After few months she was able to produce 1 male and 1 female goat and gaining Nrs. 25,000.00 and Now she has 7 goats again. Now her goat gave a 3 male goats so she is very happy. Her familys are supporting her to raising the goat. Her income is increasing steadily and she is not suffering from any type of financial crisis to handle the household economy and now she would like to thank Triangle/ASK and the donors who supported her and the village Dubagaun.

9. Micro finance update

9.1 Money collected in the fund for microloan

The fund for providing microloans has increased over the last five years. Apart from the 20,000 NRS from 2016, a sum of 106,000 paid back from previous years was added to make 126,000 NRS for distribution in 2016. The families, who got the micro loan for goat raising in 2015 have successfully repaid loans amounting to 126,000 Nrs.

The 15 families who got the micro loan for goat raising in 2015/016 have received a lot of benefits and extra money (Minimum Nrs 7000.00 to maximum Nrs 15,000.00) which was spent on dresses and books for their children, food and some clothes for the family. They feel that their livelihoods is improving, and would therefore like to remember those who supported the village. The women, children and all the villagers' health and living situation has improved because of income generation activities and awareness. All of the village committee members and villagers said that they are interested to gain our training ,awareness programme . Now they are happy and give many many thanks to the supporters of their village with new concepts. People from the village are continuing their regular committee meeting. A lot of success has been achieved. For this report one of the most significant changes is the story that has been included in front page of this report.

9.2 Use of microloan and status

- 24 families got microloans amounting to Nrs 126,000 (16 persons*Nrs 5000.00 and 4 person Nrs.10000 have started raising goats.

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
