Bhimmaya Tamang-37, NP-57, Makaibari, Kavre joined the Triangle Support Project. Her life was very hard because of her joint family (all together 12 members) and her husband has little income so it was very difficult in obtaining food because of their low income. She frequently needs to knock on the door of the local moneylender. The traditional agriculture system has not been able to provide the enough food for this family, providing only 3 to 6 months of food sufficiency from their own production.

After joining the Triangle project, she obtained the NRs 5,000 through a village committee microloan without any interest, which she used to purchase 1 goats from the locality. After few months she was able to produce 2 male and 1 female goat and gained Nrs. 35,000.00 and Now she has 7 goats again. Her income is increasing steadily and she is not suffering from any type of financial crisis to handle the household economy and now she would like to thank Triangle/ASK and the donors who supported her and the village Makaibari.

6. How were beneficiaries selected?

After finishing the settlement level planning the village committees' members again organized the meeting and made the criteria for distribution of money. Generally the villagers followed priorities for the distribution of money used by LGCDP(Local Government Community Development Programme):

- Families with no or very little land
- Poor housing conditions
- Lack of food for the whole year
- Persons with labor-based livelihoods (for others)
- Unemployed families
- No guarantee for settlement, etc
- Most earthquake affected persons (This year's priority)

7. Ongoing activities update, results of the activities

All planned activities were completed, which are described below:

All 55000.00 rupees invested for micro loan to women, poor and earthquake affected family's income generation and benefited 11 persons in different income base activities.

–Improvement drinking water source–Nrs.10,000

–Small road–Nrs.10,000

Public Social Audit: The people and the facilitators have learned that this is a necessary component to make the government and service provider accountable. We have trained the villagers, but the actual VDC Public Social Audit will take place later this year in the new context of restructure of federal state Nepal)

9. Micro finance update

9.1 Money collected in the fund for microloan

The fund for providing microloans has increased over the last three years. Apart 55,000 NRS from 2016, a sum of 62,000 paid back from previous years was added to make 1,17,000 NRS for distribution in 2016. The families, who got the micro loan for vegetables farming in 2015 have successfully repaid loans amounting to 62,000 Nrs.

The 11 families who got the micro loan for vegetables farming in 2015/016 have received a lot of benefits and extra money (Minimum Nrs 7000.00 to maximum Nrs 15,000.00) which was spent on dresses and books for their children, food and some clothes for the family. They feel that their livelihoods is improving, and would therefore like to remember those who supported the village. The women, children and all the villagers' health and living situation has improved because of income generation activities and awareness. Now they are happy and give many many thanks to the supporters of their village with new concepts. People from the village are continuing their regular savings and credit in a sustainable way and almost all villagers are involved in the micro-credit group also. A lot of success has been achieved. For this report one of the most significant changes is the story that has been included in front page of this report.

9.2 Use of microloan and status

- 11 families got microloans amounting to Nrs 55000.00 (11 persons*Nrs 5000.00) and have started raising goats.
- 11 families got microloans amounting to Nrs 67000.00 (10 person*Nrs.6000.00 and 1 family* Nrs 7000.00) and started vegetable farming.

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
