Bik Bahadur Tamang-35, NP-52, Chittee ,Kavre joined the Triangle Support Project. His life was very hard because of Joint family (all together 9members) and his family has very little income so it was very difficult in obtaining food because of low income. He has frequently needs to knock on the door of the local moneylender. The traditional agriculture system has not been able to provide the enough food for this family, providing only 3 to 6 months of food sufficiency from their own production.

After joining the Triangle project, he obtained the NRs 10,000 through a village committee microloan without any interest, which he used as investment in vegetable farming. After few months he was able to do tunnel farming and produced many types of vegetables and gained Nrs. 20,000.00 and Now he has also some vegetables left for selling. His income is increasing steadily and he is not suffering from any type of financial crisis to handle the household economy and now he would like to thank Triangle/ASK and the donors who supported him and the village Chittee gaun.

9. Micro finance update

9.1 Money collected in the fund for microloan

The fund for providing microloans has increased over the last three years. Apart from the 30,000 NRS from 2016, a sum of 80,000 paid back from previous years was added to make 1,10,000 NRS for distribution in 2016. The families, who got the micro loan for goat raising, small poultry business promotion, pig raising and vegetables farming in 2015 have successfully repaid loans amounting to 80,000 Nrs.

The 18 families who got the micro loan for goat raising, small poultry business promotion and vegetables farming in 2015/016 have received a lot of benefits and extra money (Minimum Nrs 7000.00 to maximum Nrs 15,000.00) which was spent on dresses and books for their children, food and some clothes for the family. They feel that their livelihoods is improving, and would therefore like to remember those who supported the village. The women, children and all the villagers' health and living situation has improved because of income generation activities and awareness. Now they are happy and give many many thanks to the supporters of their village with new concepts. People from the village are continuing their regular savings and credit in a sustainable way and almost all villagers are involved in the micro-credit group also. A lot of success has been achieved. For this report one of the most significant changes is the story that has been included in front page of this report.

9.2 Use of microloan and status

- 10 families got microloans amounting to Nrs 50,000.00 (10 persons*Nrs.5000) and have started raising goats.
- 6 families got microloans amounting to Nrs 60,000.00 (1 person*Nrs10,000) and started vegetable farming.

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
