He was worried about his life and frusted bechause he have 2 school going age childents and a wife and no income. Pre Bahadur in the society who got idea and solved the problems.

Now he think money is in here in the village if we want to do any types of income base activities. It is not necessary to go to the golf country or outside for money. The village committee has given him loan Nrs 10000.00 for pig raising. He was happy and strted pig raising from Triangle support fund. It was very small money but this money has work as a seeds. His micro loan for pig raising has given him an income and his family can live on. Recently he sold two pigs and worth Nrs 80000.00 and added another two again and after 4-5 month it will be ready to sell and when valuated by the local market price, another two pigs worth more than NRs 80000.00 again he said. Now it is easy to him for sending childern in better school and regular food consumption or to buy basic needs. He also repeted triangle has an idea to increase the capacity of local people and to make the interpeniour so I want to pry them who supporte in the village with innovative idea.

Nrs 49000.00 rupees were invested in micro loans to women poor and earthquake affected family's income generation and from this money 6 persons benefitted in different income based activities

<p>Public Social Audit: The people and the facilitators have learned that this is a necessary component to make the government and service provider accountable. We have trained the villagers, but the actual VDC Public Social Audit will take place later this year in the new context of restructure of federal state Nepal)</p> <p>Community Score Cards: It is one of the most important components to improve the government service to the peoples and make better and accountable of the service provider. 9. Micro finance update

9.1 Money collected in the fund for microloan

The fund for providing microloans has increased over the last five years. Apart from the 49000 Nrs from 2016, a sum of 312000 Nrs paid back from previous years was added to make 361000 Nrs for distribution in 2016. The families, who got the micro loan for goat raising, small poultry business promotion, pig raising and ginger farming in 2015 have successfully repaid loans amounting to 312000 Nrs.

The 31 families who got the micro loan for goat raising, small poultry business promotion, pig raising and ginger farming in 2015/016 have received a lot of benefits and extra money (Minimum Nrs 5000.00 to maximum Nrs 30000.00 extra in regular income) which was spent on dresses and books for their children, food and some clothes for the family. They feel that their livelihood is improving, and would therefore like to remember those who supported the village. The women, children and all the villagers' health and living situation have improved because of income generation activities and awareness. Now they are happy and give many many thanks to the supporters of their village with new concepts. People from the village are continuing their regular savings and credit in a sustainable way and almost all villagers are involved in the micro-credit group also. A lot of success has been achieved. For this report one of the most significant changes is the story that has been included in the front of this report..

9.2 Use of microloan and status

- 21 families got a microloan of Nrs 226000.00 (11 person*Nrs 10000.00, 8 persons*Nrs 13000.00, 1 person*Nrs 7000.00 and 1 person*Nrs 7000.00) and have started raising of goats.
- 9 families got a microloan of Nrs 92000.00 (5 persons*Nrs 10000.00, 3 person*Nrs 13000.00 and 1 person*Nrs 3000.00) and have started raising of pigs.
- 2 families got a microloan of Nrs 23000.00 (1 person*Nrs 13000.00 and 1 person*Nrs 10000.00) and have started ginger farming.
- 1 family got microloans amounting to Nrs 10000.00 (1 person*Nrs 10000.00) and has started small business in poultry.
- 1 family got a microloan of Nrs 10000.00 (1 person*Nrs 10000.00) and have started vegetables and fruit nurssary.

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
