She obtained the NRs 8,000 through a village committee microloan without any interest and she purchased 2 pigs kids initially from the locality. After few months she sold those 2 pigs and of worth NRs 80,000 then again from that money she use some for new 2 and for those when valuated by the local market price, pigs worth more than NRs 80000 again.

it means; now she has cancelled her interest to go to the golf and because her micro finance loan for pig raising has given her an income and she can live on easily, and she does not need to go to golf to labour work and thanks to Trianglen to give this idea to the village.

## 5. Activity Plan

### 5.1 Responsible for the implementation

The village committee plays the vital role to implement all activities, and after that the municipality's ward Secretary, the social mobilizer of ASK, the Municipality social mobilizer and the Triangle responsible person. Hari also supports in implementing and monitoring.

### 5.2 Any proposals submitted to the VDC or District and approved

5 projects were supported from government side ( 4 from municipality and 1 projects were supported from District and center:

- Sirukharka Jogisthan Secondary school building construction
- Sirukharka Jogisthan Secondary school compounding
- Training to Animal Keeping
- Production with market management to the ginger farming
- PHC/ORC building construction

### 5.3 Villagers own initiative

The villagers have to contribute minimum 20% cash and in kind (unskilled labor) as per the rules of the government of Nepal for supported projects as the above, which was done. All committee members worked voluntarily.

<p>After finishing the settlement level planning the village committees' members again organized the meeting and made the criteria for distribution of money. <p>All planned activities were completed, which are described below:  All 75000.00 rupees invested for micro loan to women, poor and earthquake affected family's income generation and benefited 14 persons in different income base activities.</p>

<p><b>Public Social Audit:</b> The people and the facilitators have learned that this is a necessary component to make the government and service provider accountable. We have trained the villagers, but the actual VDC Public Social Audit will take place later this year in the new context of restructure of federal state Nepal )</p> <p><b>Community Score Cards:</b> It is one of the most important components to improve the government service to the peoples and make better and accountable of the service provider. In the process, health posts will be targeted later this year.</p>							

**Right to Information:** Facilitators are developed and started to mobilization for public awareness.

**Other methods (SLP):** This is a very good and participatory method to know the planning system and the selection of most needed projects.

## 9. Micro finance update

### 9.1 Money collected in the fund for microloan

The fund for providing microloans has increased over the last five years. Apart from the 75,000 NRS from 2016, a sum of 320,000 paid back from previous years was added to make 395,000.00 NRS for distribution in 2016. The families, who got the micro loan for goat raising, small poultry business promotion, pig raising and vegetables farming in 2015 have successfully repaid loans amounting to 320,000 Nrs.

*From the repaid money Nrs 29000.00 has paid for PHC/ORC building construction matching fund for the village and support to make the volleyball ground repair and sports materials to the youth club and Nrs 366000.00 has been mobilized to the microloan*

The 40 families who got the micro loan for goat raising, small poultry business promotion, pig raising and vegetables farming in 2015/016 have received a lot of benefits and extra money (Minimum Nrs 4000.00 to maximum Nrs 12,000.00) which was spent on dresses and books for their children, food and some clothes for the family. They feel that their livelihood is improving, and would therefore like to remember those who supported the village. The women, children and all the villagers' health and living situation have improved because of income generation activities and awareness. Now they are happy and give many many thanks to the supporters of their village with new concepts. People from the village are continuing their regular savings and credit in a sustainable way and almost all villagers are involved in the micro-credit group also. A lot of success has been achieved. For this report one of the most significant changes is the story that has been included in the front page of this report.

### 9.2 Use of microloan and status

- 26 families got microloans amounting to Nrs 260000.00 ( 26 persons\*Nrs 10000.00) and have started raising goats.
- 5 families got a microloan of Nrs 35000.00 (5 persons\*Nrs 7000.00) and has started a small poultry business.
- 3 families got microloans amounting to Nrs 24000.00 ( 3 person\*Nrs 8000.00) and started raising pigs.
- 6 families got microloans amounting to Nrs 470000.00 (5 person\*Nrs 7000.00 and 1 person\*Nrs 12000.00) and have started bee keeping.
