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Most significant change/postcard



**Haribal Gurung - 42 NP-4 Dhapuk Syangja.** A man in the society who got idea and solved the problem. There was no one to earn in the house. He has only a few lands is there in the village. There is still used traditional farming method and the same crops like Mize, millet etc. The production of land is also insufficient only spend three months from the land production. There are no any sustainable income sources in the house. He was even very difficult to send his children in school.

From last six years, ASK Nepal cooperation with Triangle organized the support to improve livelihood through the voluntary aid program in that village. Haribal gurung was very poor so he got money from micro loan without any interest last year. Now he is being one of the model small interpinior about small poultry business promotion in the village, who sell the chicken and the meat of chicken regularly in the village and earn Nrs 40000.00 extra every 3 monthly. He has no tension for the management of the house, to send his children in the school, for clothes etc. Now he says, this is possible by the help of Triangle/ASK Nepal.

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## 6. How were beneficiaries selected?

After finishing the settlement level planning the village committees' members again organized the meeting and made the criteria for distribution of money. Generally the villagers followed priorities for the distribution of money used by LGCDP(Local Government Community Development Programme):

- Families with no or very little land
- Poor housing conditions
- Lack of food for the whole year
- Persons with labor-based livelihoods (for others)
- Unemployed families
- No guarantee for settlement, etc
- Most earthquake affected persons (This year's priority)

## 7. Ongoing activities update, results of the activities

All planned activities were completed, which are described below:

All 75000.00 rupees invested for micro loan to women, poor and earthquake affected family's income generation and benefited 10 persons in different income base activities.

## 8. Doing Democracy training

**From the relevant rubric: What did you learn from the training? Any improvements in the village because of the applied method? Any conflicts as a result of the activity? (Learning)**

**Public Social Audit:** The people and the facilitators have learned that this is a necessary component to make the government and service provider accountable. We have trained the villagers, but the actual VDC Public Social Audit will take place later this year in the new context of restructure of federal state Nepal )

**Community Score Cards:** It is one of the most important components to improve the government service to the peoples and make better and accountable of the service provider. In the process, health posts will be targeted later this year.

**Right to Information:** Facilitators are developed and started to mobilization for public awareness.

**Other methods (SLP):** This is a very good and participatory method to know the planning system and the selection of most needed projects.

## 9. Micro finance update

### 9.1 Money collected in the fund for microloan

The fund for providing microloans has increased over the last five years. Apart from the 75,000 NRS from 2016, a sum of 328,000 paid back from previous years was added to make 403,000.00 NRS for distribution in 2016. The families, who got the micro loan for goat raising, small poultry business promotion, buffelo keeping, small grocery store/restaurant, small furniture works, ginger farming, pig

raising, bee keeping and veterinary shop in 2015 have successfully repaid loans amounting to 328,000 Nrs.

The 36 families who got the micro loan for goat raising, small poultry business promotion, buffalo keeping, small grocery store/restaurant, small furniture works, ginger farming, pig raising, bee keeping and veterinary shop in 2015/016 have received a lot of benefits and extra money (Minimum Nrs 6000.00 to maximum Nrs 30,000.00 extra in regular income) which was spent on dresses and books for their children, food and some clothes for the family. They feel that their livelihood is improving, and would therefore like to remember those who supported the village. The women, children and all the villagers' health and living situation have improved because of income generation activities and awareness. Now they are happy and give many many thanks to the supporters of their village with new concepts. People from the village are continuing their regular savings and credit in a sustainable way and almost all villagers are involved in the micro-credit group also. A lot of success has been achieved. For this report one of the most significant changes is the story that has been included in section 9.

## 9.2 Use of microloan and status

- 28 families got a microloan of Nrs 207500.00 (5 persons\*Nrs 8000.00, 17 persons\*Nrs 7500.00, 2 persons\*Nrs 10000.00 and 4 persons\*Nrs 5000.00,) and have started raising of goats.
- 10 families got a microloan of Nrs 77500.00 (5 person\*Nrs 7500.00, 3 person\*Nrs 9000.00, 1 person\*Nrs 8000.00 and 1 person\*Nrs 5000.00) and has started a small poultry business.
- 5 families got a microloan of Nrs 37500.00 (7 persons\*Nrs 7500.00) and has started a buffalo keeping.
- 1 family got the microloan Nrs 15000 (1 person\*Nrs 15000.00) and started the small furniture works for the villagers.
- 3 families got the microloan Nrs 25500.00 (1 Persons\*Nrs 10500 and 2 person\*Nrs 7500.00) and started the small grocery store/restaurant.
- 1 family got microloans amounting to Nrs 7500.00 (1 person\*Nrs 7500.00) and has started veterinary shop.
- 1 family got microloans amounting to Nrs 10000.00 (1 person\*Nrs 10000.00) and has started electrical shop in the village.
- 1 family got microloans amounting to Nrs 10000.00 (1 person\*Nrs 10000.00) and has started bee keeping.
- 1 family got microloans amounting to Nrs 7500.00 (1 person\*Nrs 7500.00) and has started pig raising.
- 1 families got the microloan Nrs 5000(1 person\*Nrs 5000.00) and started the gingerfarming.
