

REPORT FROM ASK/TRIANGLE

NP-41 LAUSIBOT BHARSYANG

GANDAKI PROVINCE - SYANGJA NEPAL



Sita Lamichhane is a 35 years old widow from NP-41 from Lausibot Bharsyang village. She became a widow 2 years ago when her husband died in a car accident while working in Saudi-Arabia. She is now alone with three young daughters and one son. She has no income and is only entitled NPR 1000 per month through government from last year. Sita does not have any land and works for small daily wages on other villagers' land. To send the children at to school and for food she has to knock the door of personal money lenders (with a 25% interest rate).

After joining the Triangle Support Project from last years, she has got Nrs. 15,000.00 as a grant through a village committee to send her children to the school. Now see is feeling easy and sending her children in school regularly. She is not suffering from small type of financial crisis to handle the household expenditure now because of the support from the villagers too. She told us with her smile "I would like to thank Triangle, Ronja and team who are helping to the helpless peoples". Then we found in her eyes only tear, tear and tear like a spring.

After finishing the settlement level planning the village committee's members organized another meeting and established criteria for the distribution of money. Generally, the villagers followed priorities for the distribution of money used by LGCDP (Local Government Community Development Program) indicators:

<p>All planned activities were completed. Out of the grant Nrs 75000.00 (DKK 5000), Nrs 54000 was invested for micro loan to women, poor and needy people for different income generation activities and benefited 6 families, Nrs 15000.00 paid as a grant for scholarship to the widow women’s children and Nrs 6000.00 is in bank account of village as per the rule of bank. Out of 6 families who got microloan;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 5 families got a microloan of Nrs 45000.00 (5 persons*Nrs 9000.00) and have started raising of goats. • 1 family got a microloan of Nrs 9000 (1 person*Nrs 9000.00) and have started commercial and off season/seasonable vegetables farming.
