Rupa BK called dalit and untouchable from NP- 42 Sepat village is happy because she got a micro-loan Nrs. 4900.00 from Village committee to raise goats. She bought 1 goat and the goat has given 2 kids after a month.

Now she has confidence that those 2 kids will earn nearly Nrs 25000.00 after a few months and she will repay the micro loan, use some money for food and dress. She is confident also about increasing the number of goats too in her farm soon.

She was happy because her husband did not send any from last 2 years and from now she did not need to depend on others for small financial crisis. She told "It is possible because of the Triangle and individual donor so I would like to thank you who support us in the big village and for me also".

5. Activity Plan

5.1 Responsible for the implementation

The village committee plays the vital role to implement all activities. After that the rural municipality's ward Secretary, the social mobilizer of ASK, the rural municipality social mobilizer and the Triangle responsible person Hari and Lekhnath also supports in implementing and monitoring.

5.2 Any proposals submitted to the Municipality or District and approved

11 projects were supported from government side (10 by municipality and 1 by central government):

- Vegetables seed distribution Aandhikhola soil conservation from Lamakhet to Jugle
- School compounding
- Lamakhet Irrigation canal repairing
- Motor able road constriction from Khaureto to Aandhikhola.
- Motorable road build from Kamere to Sepat.
- Naumati Baja Management at Sepat
- Mother groups building built at Sepat
- Motor able road build from Sepat to Bangsing.
- Irrigation canal from Lausikhola to Sepatatri.
- Irrigation canal repairing Diha

5.3 Villagers own initiative

The villagers have to contribute a minimum 20% cash/ kind (unskilled labor) as per the rules of the government of Nepal for supported projects as the above, which was done. All committee members worked voluntarily for Triangle support activities.

6. How were beneficiaries selected?

After finishing the settlement level planning the village committee's members organized another meeting and established criteria for the distribution of money. Generally, the villagers followed priorities for the distribution of money used by LGCDP (Local Government Community Development Program) indicators:

- Families with no or very little land
- Needy people
- Poor housing conditions and Lack of food for the whole year
- Persons with labor-based livelihoods (for others)
- Unemployed families and needy people
- No guarantee for settlement and most earthquake affected persons.

7. Ongoing activities update, results of the activities from Donor funding in 2017

All planned activities were completed. The grant Nrs 75000.00 (DKK 5000), Nrs 70000 was invested for micro loan to women, poor and needy people for different income generation activities and benefited 14 families and Nrs 5000.00 is in bank account of village as per the rule of bank. Out of 14 families;

- 12 families got a microloan of Nrs 58800.00 (12 persons*Nrs 4900.00) and have started raising of goats.
- 2 families got a microloan of Nrs 11200 (2 persons*Nrs 5600.00) and have started commercial and off season/seasonable vegetables farming.

8. Doing Democracy training
