She has plans to increase the number of goats next year in her farm because normally the goat gives kids twice in a year. Now she did not need to dependent on others for small financial crisis. Not only Saraswati but also her two children and the father in law are happy with this support from Triangle/Individual Danish donor.

6. How were beneficiaries selected?

After finishing the settlement level planning the village committee's members organized another meeting and established criteria for the distribution of money. Generally, the villagers followed priorities for the distribution of money used by LGCDP (Local Government Community Development Program) indicators:

- Families with no or very little land
- Needy people
- Poor housing conditions and Lack of food for the whole year
- Persons with labor-based livelihoods (for others)
- Unemployed families and needy people
- No guarantee for settlement and most earthquake affected persons.

7. Ongoing activities update, results of the activities from Donor funding in 2017

All planned activities were completed. The grant Nrs 75000.00 (DKK 5000), Nrs 70000 was invested for micro loan to women, poor and needy people for different income generation activities and benefited 9 families and Nrs 5000.00 is in bank account of village as per the rule of bank. Out of 9 families;

- 9 families got a microloan of Nrs 70000.00 (8 persons*Nrs 7500.00 and 1 person* Nrs 10000.00) and have started raising of goats.


