Ruma BK- called Dalit and Untouchable women - 25 years

NP-45 Narikot Baskot Dahamarare Syangja.

There was no one to earn in the house. So, she sent her husband to a Gulf country to work by taking a loan from a money lender with high % of interest. It is very difficult to repay the loan to the money lender from the salary of her husband. She has only little land with traditional farming method which does not produce sufficient food for a year. She was worried at seeing her situation.

From last year, ASK Nepal in cooperation with Triangle organized support to improve livelihood through the money of individual donor to the village. Ruma was very poor but energetic young women so she succeeds to get a microloan Nrs 10000.00 without any interest and used to purchase 100 small chickens. After 3 months she was able to sell those chickens with at the higher price than purchased and made thirty thousand rupees. Now she has again 200 small chickens and she believes after 3 month she will get more benefits. She told "no crisis now for food and small financial income and it was possible because of Triangle/Donor direct support".

5.1 Responsible for the implementation

The village committee plays the vital role to implement all activities. After that the rural municipality's ward Secretary, the social mobilizer of ASK, the rural municipality social mobilizer and the Triangle responsible person Hari and Lekhnath also supports in implementing and monitoring.

5.2 Any proposals submitted to the Municipality or District and approved

5 projects were supported from government side (all 5 by municipality):

- Foot trail repairing from Manchekotauka to Daharmuni
- Foot trail repairing from Manchekotauka to Baina

- Irrigation canal construction from Tunikhola to Thulakhet
- Motorable road construction from Daha, GhumauneChaupari to Community building
- Bee keeping training with support hive with bee

5.3 Villagers own initiative

The villagers have to contribute a minimum 20% cash/ kind (unskilled labor) as per the rules of the government of Nepal for supported projects as the above, which was done. All committee members worked voluntarily for Triangle support activities.

6. How were beneficiaries selected?

After finishing the settlement level planning the village committee's members organized another meeting and established criteria for the distribution of money. Generally, the villagers followed priorities for the distribution of money used by LGCDP (Local Government Community Development Program) indicators:

- Families with no or very little land
- Needy people
- Poor housing conditions and Lack of food for the whole year
- Persons with labor-based livelihoods (for others)
- Unemployed families and needy people
- No guarantee for settlement and most earthquake affected persons.

7. Ongoing activities update, results of the activities from Donor funding in 2017

All planned activities were completed. The grant Nrs 75000.00 (DKK 5000), Nrs 70000 was invested for micro loan to women, poor and needy people for different income generation activities(Goat and vegetables in the SLP later they added as per demand/needs- buffalo and chicken) and benefited 8 families and Nrs 5000.00 is in bank account of village as per the rule of bank. Out of 7 families;

- 5 families got a microloan of Nrs 40000.00 (2 persons*Nrs 10000.00, 2 persons*Nrs 7000.00 and 1

person*Nrs 6000.00) and have started raising of goats.

- 1 family got a microloan of Nrs 10000 (1 person*Nrs 10000.00) and have started commercial and off season/seasonable vegetables farming.
- 1 family got a microloan of Nrs 10000 (1 person*Nrs 10000.00) and have started male buffalo keeping.
- 1 family got a microloan of Nrs 10000 (1 person*Nrs 10000.00) and have started small poultry business promotion.
