NP- 48 KHADKERI ODHARE GHYANGSYANGDI GANDAKI PROVINCE - SYANGJA NEPAL

Most significant change/postcard



Dilmaya Paudel -51 year ole woman, NP-48 Khadkeri Odhare Ghyansyangdi village has joined the Triangle Support Project. Her life was hard. They have no sustainable income so her 3 son have left the family and went to the town because of a lack of opportunities in the village. Husband was a social person but no income. She has difficulty in obtaining foods because her sons neither provide any money nor come home to support them. She frequently needs to knock on the door of the local moneylender to fulfill her needs. They have very little land and traditional agriculture system has not been able to provide enough food for a year to this family.

With the support of Triangle grant she obtained the NRs 10,000 through a village committee microloan without any interest and she added some from herself, which she used to purchase 3 pregnant goats from the locality. Within one year those goats gave 8 kids and she started to rear. She already sold 3 goats and worth NRs 25,000 and recently he has 8 goats again. Her income is increasing steadily and now she is not suffering from small types of financial crisis to handle her household.

6. How were beneficiaries selected?							
After finishing the settlement level planning the village committee's members organized another meeting and							

established criteria for the distribution of money. Generally, the villagers followed priorities for the distribution of money used by LGCDP (Local Government Community Development Program) indicators:

- Families with no or very little land
- Needy people
- Poor housing conditions and Lack of food for the whole year
- Persons with labor-based livelihoods (for others)
- Unemployed families and needy people
- No guarantee for settlement and most earthquake affected persons.

7. Ongoing activities update, results of the activities from Donor funding in 2017

All planned activities were completed. The grant Nrs 75000.00 (DKK 5000), Nrs 70000 was invested for micro loan to women, poor and needy people for different income generation activities and benefited 7 families and Nrs 5000.00 is in bank account of village as per the rule of bank. Out of 7 families;

- 5 families got a microloan of Nrs 50000.00 (5 persons*Nrs 10000.00) and have started raising of goats.
- 2 families got a microloan of Nrs 20000 (2 persons*Nrs 10000.00) and have started small poultry business promotion.
