Fulmaya Tamang –32, NP-53 Chhapgaun joined the Triangle Support Project. Her life was hard because of the low income of family so it was very difficult obtaining food because of low income. The traditional agriculture system has not been able to provide enough food for this family, providing only 3 to 6 months of food sufficiency from their own production. For the fulfilment of this basic needs husband is now in working in the Gulf.

After joining the Triangle project, Fulmaya obtained NRs 10,000 through a village committee microloan without any interest, which she used to purchase 2 goats from the locality. After few months she was able to produce 3 male goat and gaining Nrs. 30,000.00 and now she has 9 goats again. Her income is increasing steadily and she is not suffering from any type of financial crisis to handle the household economy. By seeing her increased income her husband wants to cancel and return from Gulf to support her and to increase goat farming. Now she would like to thank Triangle/ASK and the donor who supported her and the village Chhapgaun.

9. Micro finance update

9.1 Money collected in the fund for microloan

Apart from the 75000 NRS from 2017, a sum of 65000 paid back from previous years was added to make 140000 NRS for distribution in 2017. The families, who got the micro loan for goat raising, small poultry business promotion and vegetables farming in 2016 have successfully repaid loans amounting to 65,000 Nrs.

The 14 families got the micro loan for goat raising, small poultry business promotion and vegetables farming in 2016. The women, children and all the villagers' health and living situation has improved because of income generation activities and awareness. Now they are happy and give many many thanks to the supporters of their village with new concepts. People from the village are continuing their regular savings and credit in a sustainable way and almost all villagers are involved in the micro-credit group also. A lot of success has been achieved. For this report one of the most significant changes is the story that has been included in front page of this report.

9.2 Use of microloan and status

- 10 families got microloans amounting to Nrs 100000.00 (10persons*Nrs 10000.00) and have started vegetable farming.
- 4 families got microloans amounting to Nrs 40000.00 (4 person*Nrs 10000.00) and started raising goat.
