Sunmaya Tamang-61, NP-4, Dubagaun, Kavre joined the Triangle Support Project. Her life was very hard because of the big families (all together 13 members) and she has little income so it was very difficult obtaining food because of low income. Traditional agriculture system providing only 3 to 6 months of food sufficiency from their own production.

By seeing the situation, the village committee provided the microloan Nrs 5,000.00 without any interest, which she used to purchase one goat from the neighbor. After a few months that female goat was able to produce two kids and later while she sold, she gained Nrs. 25,000.00. Now again her female goat gave 3 male goats, so she is very happy.

Her families are supporting her to raising the goat more and more. Her income is increasing now and she is thinking that after sometimes it will not be necessary to knock the door of personal money lender and suffering from small types of financial crisis to handle the household economy. She told "thank you Triangle for supporting and to find the way of income sources.

<p>After finishing the settlement level planning the village committees’ members again organized the meeting and made the criteria for distribution of money. 9. Micro finance update
9.1 Money collected in the fund for microloan
<p>The fund for providing microloans has increased over the last five years. Apart from the 75,000 NRS from 2017, a sum of 126,000 paid back from previous years was added to make 201,000 NRS for distribution in 2017/018. The families, who got the micro loan for goat raising, small poultry business promotion, vegetables farming in 2016 have successfully repaid loans amounting to 126,000Nrs.</p> <p>The 24 families who got the micro loan for goat raising, small poultry business promotion, and vegetables farming in 2016/017 have received a lot of benefits and extra money (Minimum Nrs7000.00 to maximum Nrs15,000.00) which was spent on dresses and books for their children, food and some clothes for the family. They feel that their livelihoods is improving, and would therefore like to remember those who supported the village. The women, children and all the villagers' health and living situation has improved because of income generation activities and awareness. All of the village committee members and villagers said that they are interested to gain our training, awareness program. Now they are happy and give many many thanks to the supporters of their village with new concepts. People from the village are continuing their regular committee meeting. A lot of success has been achieved. For this report one of the most significant changes is the story that has been included in front page of this report.</p>
9.2 Use of microloan and status



- 29 families got microloans amounting to Nrs 201,000 (28 persons*Nrs 7000.00 and 1 person Nrs.5000 and have started raising goats.

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
