We have trained the villagers, but the actual VDC Public Social Audit will take place later this year in the new context of restructure of federal state Nepal)</p> <p>Community Score Cards: NA</p> <p>Right to Information: Facilitators have been trained and started to mobilization for public awareness.</p> <p>Other methods (SLP): This is a very good and participatory method to know the planning system and the selection of most needed projects.</p>			
9. Micro finance update			
9.1 Money collected in the fund for microloan			
<p>The fund for providing microloans has been repaid and and collected Nrs. 50,000 The families, who got the micro loan for goat raising, small poultry business promotion, vegetables farming.</p> <p>They feel that their livelihoods is improving, and would therefore like to remember those who supported the village. The women, children and all the villagers' health and living situation has improved because of income generation activities and awareness. Now they are happy and give many many thanks to the supporters of their village with new concepts. People from the village are continuing their regular savings and credit in a sustainable way and almost all villagers are involved in the micro-credit</p>			

group also. A lot of success has been achieved. For this report one of the most significant changes is the story that has been included in front page of this report.

9.2 Use of microloan and status

- 9 families got microloans amounting to Nrs 50000.00 (9 persons*Nrs 5000.00) and have started raising goats and vegetable farming again.
- *Money from 2017 is not used and it is in the bank.*
