Sarita Tamang-26,NP-57,Makaibari Kavre joined the Triangle Support Project. Her life was very hard because of her joint family (all together 9 members). Her husband went to the Gulf without any information and did not send any money so she felt very bad and crisis of money for food and other very basic needs.

She was getting small salary being lead-farmer organic vegetable framing, but it was also difficult to fulfillment needs. By seeing this situation the village committee paid NRs 10,000.00 without any interest, which she used to growing vegetable. After a few months she was able to produce a lot of vegetables (tomato cauli flower, coriander, lettuce, cabbage etc) and sold it in the market. Last year she gained Nrs. 30,000 extra and this year she is increasing the farm with two green house and now she has a lot of vegetables for sale. Her income is increasing steadily now and she would like to thank Triangle/ASK and the donors who supported her and the village Makaibari.

9. Micro finance update

9.1 Money collected in the fund for microloan

The fund for providing microloans has increased over the last three years. Apart from the 77,000 NRS from 2017/018, a sum of 117000 paid back from previous years was added to make 194,000 NRS for distribution in 2017/018. The families, who got the micro loan for goat raising, small poultry business promotion, pig raising and vegetables farming in 2016/017 have successfully repaid loans amounting to 117,000 Nrs.

The 11 families who got the micro loan for goat raising, small poultry business promotion, pig raising and vegetables farming in 2016/017 have received a lot of benefits and extra money (Minimum Nrs7000.00 to maximum Nrs15,000.00) which was spent on dresses and books for their children, food and some clothes for the family. They feel that their livelihood is improving, and would therefore like to remember those who supported the village. The women, children and all the villagers' health and living situation has improved because of income generation activities and awareness. Now they are happy and give many many thanks to the supporters of their village with new concepts. People from the village are continuing their regular savings and credit in a sustainable way and almost all villagers are involved in the micro-credit group also. A lot of success has been achieved. For this report one of the most significant changes is the story that has been included in front page of this report.

9.2 Use of microloan and status

- 15 families got microloans amounting to Nrs 102000.00 (12 persons*Nrs 5500.00 and 3 persons*12000.00) and have started raising goats.
- 14 families got microloans amounting to Nrs 88000.00 (11 person*Nrs.5000.00, 2 persons* 13000.00 and 1 person*9000.00) and started vegetable farming.

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
