Now he has cancelled his ticket to Qatar, because his microloan for goats has given him an income and his family can live on and he does not need to go to Qatar to labour work.

Narayan had a lot of problems. He went to Qatar 2 times but did not get either a good job or income. He was worried about his life and frustrated because he has 2 school age going children, old aged father and mother and wife has no income. Narayan got the idea to be a self employment at his own village because of the Triangle individual donor.

How were beneficiaries selected?</p> <p>After finishing the settlement level planning the village committee's members organized another meeting and established criteria for the distribution of money. Generally, the villagers followed priorities for the distribution of money used by LGCDP (Local Government Community Development Program) indicators:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Families with no or very little land • Needy people • Poor housing conditions and lack of food for the whole year • Persons with labor-based livelihoods (for others) • Unemployed families and needy people • No guarantee for settlement and most earthquake affected persons.
<p>7. Ongoing activities update, results of the activities from Donor funding in 2017)</p> <p>All planned activities were completed. The grant Nrs 75000.00 (DKK 5000) invested for micro loan to women, poor and needy people for different income generation and benefited 9 families. Out of 9 families;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 5 families got a microloan of Nrs 35000.00 (5 persons*Nrs 7000.00) and have started raising of goats. • 3 families got a microloan of Nrs 30000.00 (3 persons*Nrs 10000.00) and have started a small poultry business. • 1 family got microloans amounting to Nrs 10000.00 (1 person*Nrs 10000.00) and has started bee keeping.
<p>8. Doing Democracy training</p> <p>From the relevant rubric: What did you learn from the training? Any improvements in the village because of the applied method? Any conflicts as a result of the activity? (Learning)</p> <p>Public Social Audit: The people and the facilitators have learned that this is a necessary component to make the government and service provider accountable. We have trained the villagers, but the actual VDC Public Social Audit will take place later this year in the new context of restructure of federal state Nepal, ie with ward and municipality (VDC is abolished).</p> <p>Community Score Cards: It is one of the most important components to improve the government service to the peoples and make the service provider better and accountable. In the process, health posts will be targeted later this year.</p> <p>Right to Information: The knowledge about RTI is now increased.</p> <p>Other methods (SLP): This is a very good and participatory method to know the planning system and the selection of most needed projects. The villagers are now committed to do the SLP themselves.</p>
<p>9. Micro finance update</p>
<p>9.1 Money collected in the fund for microloan</p>
<p>The fund for providing microloans has increased over the last eight years. Apart from the 75,000 NRS from 2017, a sum of 403000Nrs paid back from previous years and Nrs 40000.00 was spent to build community</p>

house and remaining Nrs 363000.00 was added to make 438000.00 NRS for distribution in 2017/018. The 52 families, who got the micro loan for goat raising, small poultry business promotion, buffalo raising, pig raising, small furniture works, small grocery store/restaurant, veterinary shop, electrical shop, ginger farming and bee keeping in 2016/017 have successfully repaid loans amounting to 403000 Nrs.

9.2 Use of microloan and status

- 26 families got a microloan of Nrs 202000.00 (21 persons*Nrs 7000.00, 4 persons*Nrs 10000.00 and 1 person*Nrs 15000.00) and have started raising of goats.
- 8 families got a microloan of Nrs 87000.00 (3 persons*Nrs 10000.00, 7 persons*Nrs 5000.00, 2 persons*Nrs 7000.00 and 1 person*Nrs 8000.00) and has started a small poultry business.
- 2 families got microloans amounting to Nrs 40000.00 (2 person*Nrs 20000.00) and has started bee keeping.
- 6 families got a microloan of Nrs 32000.00 (5 persons*Nrs 5000.00 and 1 person*Nrs 7000.00) and has started a buffalo keeping.
- 1 family got microloans amounting to Nrs 20000.00 (1 person*Nrs 20000.00) and has started veterinary shop.
- 1 family got microloans amounting to Nrs 5000.00 (1 person*Nrs 5000.00) and has started electrical shop in the village.
- 1 family got the microloan Nrs 15000.00 (1 Persons*Nrs 15000.00) and started the small grocery store/restaurant.
- 1 family got the microloan Nrs 10000 (1 person*Nrs 10000.00) and started the small furniture works for the villagers.
- 1 family got the microloan Nrs 7000.00 (1 Persons*Nrs 7000.00) and started the small vegetable shop.
