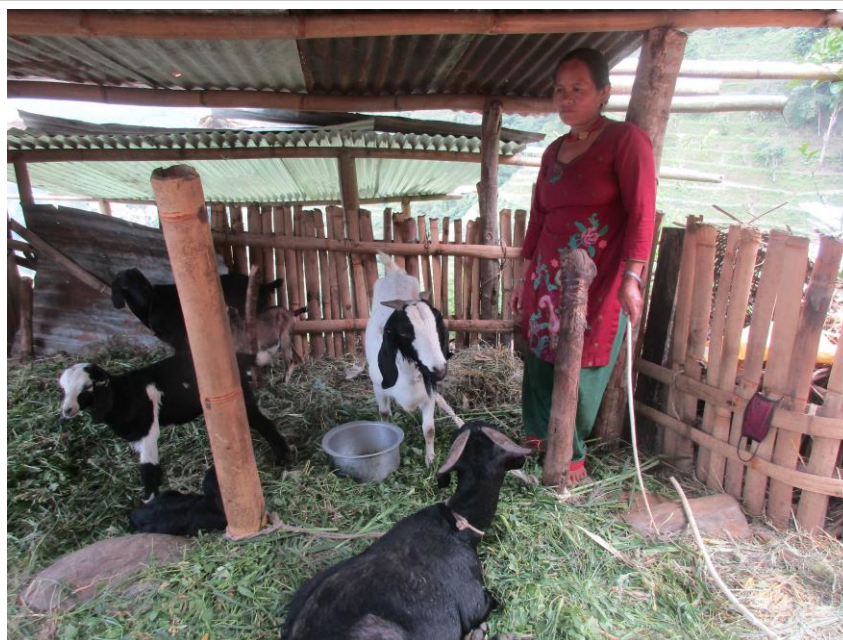


REPORT FROM ASK/TRIANGLE

BAGMATI PROVINCE - KAVRE NEPAL



Sushma Tamang- 32 years women, NP54, Dubagaun, Kavre joined the Triangle Support Project. Her life was very hard because of the big families (all together 13 members). Traditional agriculture system providing her only 3 to 6 months of food sufficiency from their own production.

By seeing the situation, the village committee provided the microloan Nrs 5,000.00 without any interest, which she used to purchase one goat from the neighbor. After a few months that female goat was able to produce two kids and later when she sold them, she gained Nrs. 25,000.00. Now again her female goat gave 3 male goats so she is very happy.

*Her families are supporting her to raising more and more goats. Her income is increasing now and she is thinking that after sometimes it will not be necessary to knock the door of personal money lender and suffering from small types of financial crisis to handle the household economy. She told "thank you Triangle and the donor **Torben Nøhr***

6. How were beneficiaries selected?							
After finishing the settlement level planning the village committee members again organized the meeting and made the criteria for distribution of money. Generally the villagers followed priorities for the distribution of money used by LGCDP (Local Government Community Development Programme): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Families with no or very little land • Poor housing conditions • Lack of food for the whole year • Persons with labor-based livelihoods (for others) • Unemployed families • No guarantee for settlement, etc • Most earthquake affected persons 							
7. Ongoing activities update, results of the activities from Danish Donor funding in 2019							
All planned activities were completed. Out of the grant DKK 5000 (equivalent to Nrs - NRS 82000), All NRS 82000 was invested for micro loan to women, poor and needy people for income generation and							

benefited 10 persons.

Out of 10 persons who took microloan for 2019;

- 10 families got microloan amounting to NRS 82000 (10 persons*NRS 8200) and have started vegetable farming.

8. Doing Democracy training

Public Social Audit: The people and the facilitators have learned that this is a necessary component to make the government and service provider accountable. Facilitators were developed.

Community Score Cards: It is one of the most important components to improve the government service to the peoples and make the service provider better and accountable.

Right to Information: The knowledge about RTI is now increased. (anti-corruption measure)

Other methods (SLP): This is a very good and participatory method to know the planning system and the selection of most needed projects.

9. Micro finance update

9.1 Money collected in the fund for microloan generated from Danish donor funding and outcomes

The fund for providing microloans has increased slowly slowly over the last 10 years. The 20 families, who got micro loans for raising of goats and commercial and off season/seasonable vegetables farming in 2018/019 have successfully repaid loans NRS 201000 for amounting to 283000 NRS. People are happy with such kind of support to the village to address the basic and real needs of the citizens. The 20 families mentioned above have received extra money (minimum NRS 10000 to maximum NRS 40000) which was spent on dresses and books for their children, food and some clothes for the family. They feel that their livelihood is improving, and would therefore like to remember/thanks to donor **Torben Nøhr** who supported the village.

9.2 Use of microloan and status

- 15 families got microloans amounting to NRS 201000 (15 persons*NRS 13400 have started raising goats and small poultry business promotion.
- 10 families got microloans amounting to NRS 82000 (10 persons*NRS 8200 have started vegetable farming.
