## 5. Activity Plan

### 5.1 Responsible for the implementation

The village committee plays the vital role to implement all activities, and after that the ward no.1 ward committee coordinator, the social mobilizer of ASK, the ward members and the Triangle responsible person supports in implementing and monitoring.

### 5.2 Any proposals submitted to the Municipality or District and approved

4 projects were supported from government side ( 3 from municipality and 1 projects were supported from District and center:

- Making bhegtole irrigation from khorongkhola
- Protection of Dhadagaun drinking water source
- Maintenance of Dharapani drinking water source
- Planning for Drinking water/irrigation from pokhari river to bhadrakali school

<b>5.3 Villagers own initiative</b>							
The villagers have to contribute a minimum 2% cash plus 18 to 30 % unskill labor works as per the rules of the government of Nepal for supported projects as the above, which was done. All the executive member of committees is working voluntarily for Triangle money distribution, monitoring etc.

Generally the villagers followed priorities for the distribution of money used by LGCDP (Local Government Community Development Programme):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Families with no or very little land</li> <li>• Poor housing conditions</li> <li>• Lack of food for the whole year</li> <li>• Persons with labor-based livelihoods (for others)</li> <li>• Unemployed families</li> <li>• No guarantee for settlement, etc</li> <li>• Most earthquake affected persons</li> </ul>

<p>All planned activities were completed, the money DKK 5000 (NRS 82000) from Triangle annual member donation in Denmark is used for;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• NRS 75000 has been invested for vegetable farming, goat raising and small poultry business promotion for 8 farmers.</li> <li>• NRS 7000 spent for scholarship to the 7 childrens who have difficult to purchase dress and notebooks.</li> </ul>							

## 8. Doing Democracy training

**Public Social Audit:** The people and the facilitators have learned that this is a necessary component to make the government and service provider accountable. Facilitators were developed.

**Community Score Cards:** It is one of the most important components to improve the government service to the peoples and make the service provider better and accountable.

**Right to Information:** The knowledge about RTI is now increased. (anti-corruption measure)

**Other methods (SLP):** This is a very good and participatory method to know the planning system and the selection of most needed projects.

## 9. Micro finance update

### 9.1 Money collected in the fund for microloan generated from Danish donor funding and outcomes

The fund for providing microloans has increased slowly slowly over the last 6 years. The 9 families, who got micro loans for raising of goats and commercial and off season/seasonable vegetables farming in 2018/019 have successfully repaid loans NRS 125000 for amounting to 200000 NRS. People are happy with such kind of support to the village to address the basic and real needs of the citizens. The 9 families mentioned above have received extra money (minimum NRS 10000 to maximum NRS 30000) which was spent on dresses and books for their children, food and some clothes for the family. They feel that their livelihood is improving, and would therefore like to remember/thanks to donor **Jørgen Strøbech** who supported the village.

### 9.2 Use of microloan and status

- 10 families got microloans amounting to NRS 100000 (10 persons\*NRS 10000) and have started raising goats.
- 4 families got microloans amounting to NRS 100000 (4 persons\*NRS 25000) and have started small poultry business promotion.
