The children's education is now easy for him to afford, but before he had trouble creating surplus and having enough money to pay for the education.*

*After joining the Triangle project, he got NRS 7000 microloan through a village committee which he used to vegetable farming and agricultural work. Now he is earning Nrs. 10,000.00 to 40,000.00 every month. His income is increasing day by day and he is now not suffering from any type of financial crisis to handle the household economy. Finally, he would like to thank the Danish donor **Christian Erik Repsdorph** who supported including Triangle/ASK.*

6. How were beneficiaries selected?				
<p>After finishing the settlement level planning the village committee members again organized the meeting and made the criteria for distribution of money. Generally the villagers followed priorities for the distribution of money used by LGCDP (Local Government Community Development Programme):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Families with no or very little land • Poor housing conditions • Lack of food for the whole year • Persons with labor-based livelihoods (for others) • Unemployed families • No guarantee for settlement, etc • Most earthquake affected persons 				
7. Ongoing activities update, results of the activities from Danish Donor funding in 2019				
<p>All planned activities were completed. Out of the grant DKK 5000 (equivalent to Nrs - NRS 82000), NRS 18000 was spent for mini teller to plough the farm fields and NRS 64000 invested for micro loan to women, poor and needy people for income generation and benefited 10 persons.</p> <p>Out of 10 persons who took microloan for 2019;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 10 families got microloan amounting to NRS 64000 (9 persons*NRS 7000 and 1 person*NRS 1000- to add last year money) and have started vegetable farming.

<p>Public Social Audit: The people and the facilitators have learned that this is a necessary component to make the government and service provider accountable. Facilitators were developed.</p> <p>Community Score Cards: It is one of the most important components to improve the government service to the peoples and make the service provider better and accountable.</p> <p>Right to Information: The knowledge about RTI is now increased. 9. Micro finance update
9.1 Money collected in the fund for microloan generated from Danish donor funding and outcomes
<p>The fund for providing microloans has increased slowly slowly over the last 5 years. The 42 families, who got micro loans for raising of goats and commercial and off season/seasonable vegetables farming in 2018/019 have successfully repaid loans NRS 312000 for amounting to 376000 NRS. People are happy with such kind of support to the village to address the basic and real needs of the citizens. The 42 families mentioned above have received extra money (minimum NRS 20000 to maximum NRS 40000) which was spent on dresses and books for their children, food and some clothes for the family. They feel that their livelihood is improving, and would therefore like to remember/thanks to donor Christian Erik Repsdorph who supported the village.</p>
9.2 Use of microloan and status
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 33 families got microloans amounting to NRS 231000 (33 persons*NRS 7000) and have started raising goats. • 21 families got microloans amounting to NRS 145000 (20 person*NRS 7000 and 1 person*NRS 5000) and started vegetable farming.
